CAPTAIN FLINT HOUSE, AMHERST TOWNSHIP

The general shape of this house and its doorway, with its side and top lights, are the Greek Revival features of this house. The remarkable bargeboard trim at the gables, the porches and the floor-length casement windows are Gothic Revival features. The interior has undergone extensive alteration; the stairway is original.



Williams' sketch of Lorain County gives a biographical sketch of Captain Flint, as well as a drawing of this house. The bargeboard trim and porches may have been added by Flint at a later date, but before 1879. The late husband of the present owner was born in this house and lived here seventy years. Commercial development threatens the existence of this house.
